Academic Metrics

Undergraduate students who engaged with the Dream Center during Fall 2023 have a slightly lower average GPA (.19 points GPA difference) when compared to the U of U students entering Fall 2023 GPA (2.52). Regardless of the Dream Center students' slightly lower GPA than their U of U peers who do not engage with the center, the Dream Center provides the support students need to maintain a healthy GPA and the resources needed for students to navigate the U of U's environment.

Students who engaged with the center have an average high school GPA .02 points higher than their peers who did not.

Three Key Initiatives

Life After College

Life After College increases students' post-graduation knowledge with an emphasis on undocumented and immigrant students. The program consists of three cohorts that focus on income generating opportunities, graduate school, and general exploration. Sessions are hosted in collaboration with various campus and community partners.

As a result of participating in the program, students reported an increase of awareness in the following areas:

Resume & CV Development	+80%
Personal Development Opportunities	+80%
Graduate School Resources	+60%
Professional Development Opportunities	+29%
Income Generating Opportunities	+20%

Visionary Scholars Program

The Visionary Scholars Program increases undergraduate undocumented students' belonging at the University of Utah by connecting students with resources, services and support available to them both on and off campus despite immigration status. By the end of the program, students will have learned how to utilize their status to be successful at the university and beyond.

ASPIRE Fellowship

The ASPIRE Fellowship provides pathways for professional development and experiential learning opportunities, fellows are appointed to an experiential learning opportunity at the Dream Center or another office on campus vetted by the Dream Center.

The Life After College program was a life-changing experience. As a first-generation, undocumented college student. I had no idea what life would be like after graduation. This program taught me a lot about the different paths I could take, such as graduate school, independent contracting, and entrepreneurship. I also learned about the obstacles I might face as an undocumented student and how overcome them. The program gave me confidence and preparedness for whatever comes next, and I am grateful for the opportunity to have taken part.
